BRUNSWICK FOOD PANTRY

Hunger is happening next door. Hunger is happening right now. How Much Need Exists in Brunswick?

Probably more than most people realize, so let's look at the numbers: from July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017 we served 2,265 families. These families are made up of 7,014 individuals, of which 1,977 were children. We provided each person three meals a day for three days for a total of 63,126 meals

served.

In 2017 we served 781 more people 7,029 more meals than in 2016.
